



#### THE WORD "PAS" -ALL MEN

•Acts 19:19 And a number of those who had practiced magic arts brought their books together and burned them in the sight of <u>all</u>.

•John 11:47-48 (ESV) So the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered the council and said, "What are we to do? For this man performs many signs. 48 If we let him go on like this, **everyone** will believe in him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation."

Isaiah 53:6 (ESV) All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of **us all**.

Hebrews 2:9 (ESV) But we see him who for a little while was made lower than the angels, namely Jesus, crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for **everyone**.

Hebrews 2:10-11 (ESV) For it was fitting that he, for whom and by whom all things exist, in bringing many sons to glory, should make the founder of their salvation perfect through suffering. 11 For he who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one source. That is why he is not ashamed to call them brothers.

### QUESTION 2

# PROBLEMS WITH MIDDLE KNOWLEDGE

Conditional future things depending on will of man are not true apart

from the will or decree of God.

God's exhaustive providence precludes the possibility that man's will is indeterminate.

There is no uncertain knowledge in God

Incompatible with God's sovereign will as certain acts come about from man's autonomous will

God's freedom to base his decisions solely on his sovereign purpose and good pleasure (Rom. 9) would be undermined, God's grace be subservient to mans will




#### CAUSAL DETERMINISM

### GREAT COMISSION



### RATIONALE

If God predestined who should be Christian than "We should be asking have God chose you?" instead of "Have you accepted Christ?" moreover no one will know who has being selected by God.

No where is Scripture does it ask have we been chosen by God The issue is addressed to Christians already chosen

### RATIONALE

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### FIRST EVANGELISTIC SERMON

Acts 2:37-39 (ESV) Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" 38 And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself."

John 6:37-40 (ESV) All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out.

38 For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me.

39 And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that **he has given me**, but raise it up on the las day.

40 For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day." Predestination is indicated by the response to Christ. It is never used as to exclude anyone. The one who chooses Christ is predestined

Versus 5 "predestined" should not be read by itself instead "predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ" which is obvious because once we accepted Christ we are adopted as sons by Jesus Christ.

### ONE LONG SENTENCE

Ephesians 1:3-6 (ESV) Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, 4 even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love 5 he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, 6 to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved.

The reason He chose us before out of all humanity is before he had pre-determined our destiny



This seems to suggest that **before the creation of the world**, some, or in this case, "The inhabitants of the earth whose names "have not been written in the book of life. It's like being predestined to become a nonbeliever.

# THERE IS NO MENTION THAT THIS REFERS TO THE TIME BEFORE CREATION

Revelation 17:8 (ESV) The beast that you saw was, and is not, and is about to rise from the bottomless pit and go to destruction. And the dwellers on earth whose <a href="mailto:names have not been written in the book of life">names have not been written in the book of life</a> from the foundation of the world <a href="will-marvel to see">will marvel to see</a> <a href="mailto:the beast">the beast</a>, because it was and is not and is to come.

#### DIVINE SOVEREINGTY

John 6:43-44 (ESV) Jesus answered them, "Do not grumble among yourselves. 44 **No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him**. And I will raise him up on the last day.

Ephesians 2:1-6 (ESV) And you were dead in the trespasses and sins 2 in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience—3 among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. 4 But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, 5 even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been **saved**— 6 and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus

2 Corinthians 5:14-21 (ESV) For the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; 15 and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised.

16 From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. 17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. 18 All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. 20 Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us.
