Case Study

Case 1 – Disunity

Gladys Ho was active in church serving in the kitchen ministry where she was administrating the culinary activities. The team would regularly cook up a nice meal for the newcomers welcome dinner or other evangelistic events.

Tessa Lai is a rather vocal person in church and has a rather disruptive habit of passing comments on the quality of the food at these events which has caused more than the occasional complaints from the women doing the cooking to Gladys. This was done using the WhatsApp chat group. Notwithstanding, the problems this has caused, it is also true that the quality of food has recently deteriorated and the ladies doing the ministry have been discouraged and hence put in less effort.

Hence a vicious cycle of disparaging comments causing discouragement which then causes poor food which then fuels further complaints which now become legitimate.

- 1. What steps can Gladys take to address the situation in a manner that will preserve the unity of the body? How should she do this?
- 2. Tessa Lai got very upset when the issue was brought up to her and has not attended church for more than a month. Should any action be taken in the light of the passage we have just read?
- 3. Is this a common kind of problem in churches? Why is it so and how can we be better prepared to deal with such problems or prevent them from occurring?
