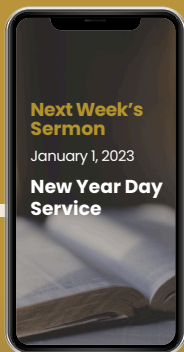

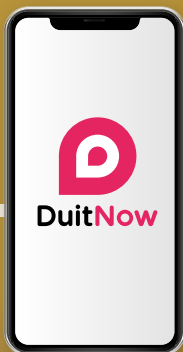
"Join a Life Group, it'll be fun," they said. Little did I know that it is one of the best decisions I have made during my twenties.

Devotion on Psalm 79 by the Youth

Scripture

Psalm 79:5,8

5 How long, Lord? Will you be angry forever?

How long will your jealousy burn like fire?

8 Do not hold against us the sins of past generations;
may your mercy come quickly to meet us,
for we are in desperate need.

Observation :

Verse 5: God is a God of justice and wrath. "How long, Lord will you be angry forever?" showed that it was a question of how long will this suffering last, not why did the suffering happen. But the good news we know is that God's wrath does not last forever, in fact, from judgment, there will be restoration.

Verse 8: God is a God of mercy. Throughout the whole Bible, we understand that all of us are made of sin and : (v8- for we are in desperate need). Even in this text, the Psalmist brings up his confession of sin to God's name (v9- for the glory of your name), because the Psalmist knew that whatever man-made atonement there was, only God can provide a greater atonement.

Application:

- It seems that the past year has been nothing but a roller coaster ride. During the earlier months of lockdown we were like: "Hehe nice lah, can work from home.", now we are sick and tired of it.
- We may ask God: "How long more?" "When will this suffering end?". For that right, we have to wait in faith. Just like the Psalmist, we remember that God is a merciful God and that at the end of the day, God will fully restore us and the world.

Prayer:

Dear God, I want to thank You for Your never-failing mercy that has been over me. I pray that I will continue to practice patience and perseverance by waiting in Your timing, and know that You are planning a great restoration plan for the world. AMEN.
