### A short background to this ministry:

I joined First Baptist Church PJ in 2001 as the Church Administrator and later as a Ministry Worker for Pastor Care attached to Subang Center. The church facilities were limited and first-time visitors were not able to fellowship with the church members.

During the week, I would contact the individual personally thanking them for visiting and worshipping with us at First Baptist Church and the conversation will develop in getting to know the individual and whether the visitor is open to us visiting.

It was at a Wednesday night Prayer Meeting in 2005 at Subang Center (as it was known at that time), when Janie Noah, Alice Yap, Doreen Soo, and I sought the Lord for guidance before we began this ministry.

The Home Visit was set on every Wednesday, we will meet at Subang Center as a team before leaving for our visit. It was just a time of fellowship, sharing a short devotion and prayer. Sister Alice Yap decided to improve her strumming of the guitar and from that time onwards we had a time of worship with our visitee.

### The blessing of the Lord continues....

From four members, the Lord has blessed the ministry and the team grew over a period of time. The initial purpose is to visit home-bound FBC members to encourage and remind them they are part of First Baptist Church even if they are home-bound. Then as the Lord directs us, we extend this fellowship to Nursing/Care Home FBC members and as well to non-Christian homes. The first-time visitors to First Baptist Church were not forgotten and as long we are welcomed, we visit them. The Visitation ministry is not only socializing with the people we visit, it has an eternal purpose. Time was well spent, not wasted, it is a privilege and not a bore-some duty.

1. "The FBC Visitation Team was initiated by Pastor Moby and his wife Janie in the year 2005. I was an adult student pursuing my psychology study program back then. Due to my eagerness to understand human behavior and interaction in a social context, I joined Pastor Moby and his wife alongside another sister in Christ.
