One senior asked me if my country is rich. I replied that every country has its own poverty index among its population. Don't look for anything on earth, you won't find anything here. Rather, look for eternal things up there.

Those who are planning to go on holiday next year, consider using your money, resources, and time for next year's Kapatid mission. Don't always pamper yourself, always think of holidays for yourself. God can use you if your heart is willing, regardless of age, at least once in

your lifetime, except for those with health problems and issues. Jesus is coming back sooner than we thought and there's still a lot of work to be done there. Kapatid, which means Brethren, expects to see new, fresh faces for next year's mission. Romans 10:15 "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"
