The Four Gospels

An interesting thing about the Bible is that there are only four Gospels while Jesus had 12 apostles. And of these four Gospels, only two were written by apostles, i.e. Matthew and John. The other two were written by Mark and Luke, who were both second generation believers.

A Gospel is a narrative on the life of Jesus. Each of the four Gospels (which means Good News) tells a different aspect of the story of Jesus' life and his teachings. From the four Gospels then, a mosaic or tapestry can be constructed on the life of Jesus, presenting him as the Messiah, the Saviour.

While covering different aspects on

the life of Jesus, the four Gospels actually complement each other. This is especially so in the first three: Matthew, Mark, and Luke. These are often referred to as the Synoptic Gospels because they include many of the same stories, often in a similar sequence and in similar or sometimes identical wording. The term synoptic means to be seen together, or synchronized viewing.

The fourth Gospel, John, is markedly different. It emphasises on what Jesus said about himself: he is the Son of Man and the Son of God. If you were to use a red-letter Bible (where the words spoken by Jesus are printed in red), you'll notice that almost the whole book of John is

red as Jesus spoke of himself.

In the book of Revelation, John the Apostle (same author as John's Gospel) was taken up into heaven and there he saw four living creatures: "The first living creature was like a lion, the second was like an ox, the third had a face like a man, the fourth was like a flying eagle." (Revelation 4:7) Each of the four living creatures, when juxtaposed with the four Gospels, gives an alignment that was realized by the early church as representing Kingship, Servanthood, Sonship, and Deity.

Here is an overview of the Gospels:

MATTHEW

- Matthew's Gospel figuratively portrays Jesus as a lion; he is the Lion of Judah. As king of the beasts, the lion is regal and royal.
- Jesus' genealogy was traced through his foster father Joseph, all the way back to King David.
- Jesus' birth attracted kings from afar to worship him.
- The Sermon on the Mount is the kingdom's manifesto.
- Matthew's Gospel is filled with Jewish ideas and customs and in many instances, addresses traditions and laws. Of particular interest was Jesus' criticism of the Scribes and Pharisees for their wrong understanding of the Mosaic Laws and how these religious figures had poorly interpreted the laws to justify their own self-righteousness.
- Jesus said: "These people honour me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. They worship me in vain, their teachings are merely human rules." (Matthew 15:8-9)

MARK

- Mark's Gospel figuratively portrays Jesus as an ox; he is a Servant. The ox is a strong and powerful animal that uses its strength not to lord over others, but instead to serve. It symbolizes controlled power, gentle strength, and meekness.
- There is no genealogy in Mark's Gospel because slaves or servants have none.
- Jesus demonstrated meekness by becoming nothing. He poured out to death.

LUKE

- Luke's Gospel portrays Jesus as a man; he is the Son of Man. He left the splendour of heaven for the hill of Golgotha. There, he laid down his life on that cruel cross for the sins of the world.
- Jesus' birth saw shepherds coming to adore him, in recognition of the Great Shepherd that he was soon

to be.

 Jesus' genealogy was traced through his mother Mary, and all the way back to Adam, the first man.
 The humanity of Jesus was also reflected in the healing and caring accounts of his earthly ministry.

JOHN

- John's Gospel figuratively portrays Jesus as an eagle; he is the Son of God. He came down from heaven to show us the way to heaven.
- Why is the eagle used to represent the Son of God?
 It is revealed that the eagle spends much of its time in the heavens above, using its sharp vision to watch over the earth.
- Jesus' genealogy is found right in the beginning in John 1:1-4. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind."
- Jesus isn't only the Son of God. He is the Word, and the Word is God (John 1:1).

THE GOSPELS

The four Gospels are the most important writings in the world because they confirm the coming of Jesus as the Saviour of the world. Like a photograph developed from a film negative, they make patent what was made latent in the Old Testament. And that is that God would send a Servant King to gather His people back to Himself. The Gospels leave no doubt that the Servant King was Jesus Christ.

The Gospels, in agreement with the Old Testament, also prophesy of Jesus' return as the King of kings and Lord of lords. His first coming was as a suffering servant and as the Lamb of God to be sacrificed for the sins of the world. His next advent will be as King of kings over the whole Earth.

It's obvious that the Gospels cannot cover every facet of Jesus' life on Earth, but enough had been written about him to know who he truly was and is. The apostle John was one of Jesus' closest friends, and he wrote in John 21:25, saying: "Now there are also many other things that Jesus did. Were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written."
