Special Connections

"Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it." - 1 Corinthians 12:27

Many years ago, though I cannot remember exactly when, I conducted a simple exercise for members of my Life Group. Each member was given a piece of A4 paper, on which each was to map out all the people groups that he/she belonged to. Each group was to be represented by a circle with a label, and the size of the circle was supposed to indicate the importance of the group to the person. All the groups must be 'active' to a certain degree, with at least some occasional contact.

On my paper, I drew a very large circle, and I titled it 'Immediate Family', namely my wife and my kids. There were many other circles of various sizes. I had, for example, 'Natural Family', which included my parents and siblings. I also catalogued numerous other groups on the paper related to school, work, and hobbies, from 'Form 5 Classmates' to 'Office Colleagues' to 'Ping Pong'. Since it was an exercise at a Life Group meeting, everyone also had circles labelled 'FBC' and 'Life Group'.

Most of you would agree that our connections and interactions with other people are an integral part of our lives. Take them away, and our existence would be reduced to emptiness and loneliness. The objective of the exercise was to give each one a pictorial gauge of where he/she stood in this important aspect of his/her life. At the same time, I was curious to know the size of church-related circles that members of my Life Group drew on their paper. In other words, I wondered how important FBC or the Life Group is to them. We then discussed the lessons learned behind the exercise, and I remember pointing out that the church-related groups depicted on the paper should stand out from the rest, in that they were 'eternal' in nature. Meaning, they epitomized our membership in the eternal kingdom of God. Hence, they are special.

Indeed, my wife and I have lived by this maxim for the longest time: FBC is special. So is our Life Group. We always look forward to Sunday worship services and Life Group meetings. We would only miss them when we are traveling. We desire to connect with all of you, as much as it is possible. FBC ranks high in our scheme of things; it is an essential part of our lives. We designate it as a priority in our lives. We drew large circles for church-related groups on our paper. Let me explain further why this is so.

There is an incident recorded at the end of Mark 3, where Jesus told His disciples, "Here are My mother and My brothers! Whoever does God's will is My brother and sister and mother." The Lord was trying to paint a picture of the family of God, to which we all belong. In Ephesians 2:19, Paul described us as members of God's household. God is our Father in

heaven, and we are His children. In a very practical sense, to my wife and me, the church is our home, our spiritual home, and fellow believers are our spiritual siblings. I believe that as a Christian matures in his/her faith, he/she would naturally desire in increasing measure to connect with other members of God's family. There will be a growing sense of belonging.

Secondly, during the Last Supper in John 13:34, Jesus commanded His disciples, "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." The Lord was ending His earthly ministry, and He would not be with them much longer. And the one thing He wished them to do was to love one another. A community of Christ's followers must be typified by love, and FBC is no exception. To my wife and me, the church is the arena where we can obey this commandment of Jesus to be connected in love to our brothers and sisters in Christ. It is the place where we can show our care and concern for fellow believers in practical ways, and vice versa, they showing the same to us. We need one another, as Paul expounded in 1 Corinthians 12, where he used the metaphor of the parts of the body to illustrate how we cannot do without each other.

Thirdly, Paul also talked in Ephesians 4 about growing together as a church, as a body of Christ. He wrote in verse 15, "...we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of Him who is the head, that is, Christ."

In the earlier part of this chapter, the apostle articulated how the body of Christ might be built up, how the church might mature, "attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." I have witnessed Christians who are not connected to the church in a committed way. I have seen their faith weakened, and some have even fallen away. To my wife and me, FBC is the place where we can grow in our faith together with the people of God, learning and serving together, while encouraging and watching out for one another.

The above are at least three reasons why the church is a 'big circle' in our lives. We give a lot of weight to our membership in this community of God's people. Let me now share with you some thoughts on how you may do likewise. How can you connect to FBC in a meaningful way? There are certainly many things you can do, such as being regular in attending Sunday worship service, or being committed in your tithing. But I would like to recommend three specific steps for you, should you decide to be a more connected and committed part of the body of Christ that is FBC:

- **1. APPLY** for church membership: Many in the community of FBC are regular worshippers. We are happy to have you if you are a regular worshipper with us. But perhaps you may want to seriously consider applying to be a member of FBC. You can always try one of Yew Lum's occasional membership classes to find out what it entails.
- **2. JOIN** a Life Group or Gamma Group: Within a big church such as FBC, it is not easy to develop close relationships with fellow believers. But at the level of a smaller group, it becomes possible to love one another and grow together, as I have explained earlier. - **3.SERVE** in a church ministry: This is by far the most effective expression of membership in the body of Christ. Serving together with other Christians is not only serving God, but it also contributes practically to your spiritual development and foundation. If this is your decision, please talk directly to the head of the ministry that you think is aligned with your gifting and interest.

May God bless you with closer connections with His people in His church. In the title of this article, I describe them as 'special connections', not only because they are eternal, but also because they are spiritually rewarding and God-honouring.


