

When Christianity became the official religion of the Roman Empire beginning from Emperor Constantine's reign, pagan influences began to creep into the church. Instead of giving up pagan deities, attempts were made to 'Christianise' them. As a result, Ishtar, the "Queen of Heaven", became

This veneration became idol worship, a practice still being adopted by the Roman Catholic Church today. Mary's images and idols are everywhere within their church buildings and devotees are encouraged to pray to them. Instead of cakes made in the image of the Queen of Heaven, today they're replaced by hot cross buns at Easter.

unscriptural veneration of Mary, the mother of Jesus.

It was therefore not surprising when one day, I saw a plaque outside a Roman Catholic Church in Bayswater, London, announcing: Church of Mary, Queen of Heaven.

It says in Exodus 20:4-5a that "You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the LORD your God am a jealous God."

The Orthodox Church does not have carvings but attempts to circumvent the second commandment by the use of religious icons. They reason that since icons are not carved, it's okay. It's not.

Non-Christian visitors stepping for the first time into First Baptist Church, Subang Jaya, are often taken aback by the lack of statues and religious images. Most Bible-believing churches are the same: no idols. At most, what we have are some murals and the cross, a symbol of the Christian faith.

Some say they require an image to remind them of God. But God specifically placed the second commandment forbidding any idols because nothing can ever depict Him.

God is so much more beautiful than anything there is, so much so that any man-made portrayal of Him, no matter how beautifully crafted, is an insult to His glory. There can never be anything comparable to God's beauty and glory.

By design, you cannot find in the Bible any text describing what Jesus looked like- his physique, or the colour of his skin, hair, and eyes. This means that all images of him are fakes.

As for Mary, the mother of Jesus, she is not to be worshipped or venerated. We acknowledge her as a humble servant of the LORD, and recognise that she was greatly blessed to be the earthly mother of our Lord Jesus Christ. Contrary to what's being taught, she was not conceived immaculately in order to conceive Jesus

It is pointless to pray to the Queen of Heaven for our requests. Remember that, even though Mary was the mother of Jesus, she also prayed to the resurrected Christ for her supplication.

It's a lie to believe that God is an angry Father who does not care to answer our prayers, so much so we need to pray to a softer and more compassionate mother figure to have our requests attended to.

Throughout the Gospels, we see a compassionate Jesus who looked upon His followers with eyes full of loving-kindness. He is more than enough to answer and provide for all of our needs, and He waits with open arms.
