Section C

Case history

In the up coming general elections suppose there are three candidates contending for the Parliamentary seat of Subang Jaya

Candidate A is an honest politician from what most people can see but comes from a religious party and intent on working to impose elements of his religion into his governing not withstanding the fact that the community is a multiracial and multi-religious one.
