

Today most Christian keeps the Sabbath as the Lord's Day. The word "Sabbath" goes back to a Hebrew root meaning "to cease" or "to stop." God commanded the Israelites to stop their work so they could rest, refresh, and refuel. Biblical history teaches us that when God freed his people from slavery in Egypt, he gave them the gift of rest, and so the Jews followed the pattern of

keeping the seventh day holy. So, the question is not whether Israel should have kept the Sabbath under the old covenant, but whether Christians should do so today? When we observe the Sabbath, we are reminded of two lovely things. One is that all true blessings are the result of his grace, not our effort. The other is that we honor him and keep the day holy of the week in order to

receive the fullness of his blessing by paying special attention to him on that day. In Exodus 20:8-11, God made this pattern a commandment. "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter...For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day. Therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.

In the New Testament, however, what Jesus says about the Sabbath goes beyond the Old Testament pattern. As in Matthew 11:28-30, he said, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

So, what exactly does the passage mean by "resting" here? Clearly, there were no errors in either passage. Do you ever start your week on Monday feeling even more exhausted than the Friday before? Many of us dread Mondays not only because it's hard to get back into the swing of things after a weekend off, but also because we have exhausted ourselves over the weekend.

I am reminded of the old saying, "Monday blues!", a statement used in the workplace. God must have anticipated our tendency to DIA (Do It All) when we should choose to rest. So how does this work in practice? As followers of Jesus, we are not required to strictly adhere to the laws that God gave to "Israel" (see Romans 14:5). They were given at a specific time to a specific group of people for a specific purpose. But the wisdom of those laws is constant, and the Sabbath law is pure gold. It is not a commandment to which we are obligated; rather, it is a promise to which we are invited. As Paul stated in Hebrews 4:9-10, "There remains, then, a Sabbath-rest for the people of God; for anyone who enters God's rest also rests from their works, just as God did from his."

Sabbath rest is an invitation to practice for the rest of one's life. It is the place where we engage God's reign in our hearts and on the earth on a regular and intentional basis. We must put down our tools and truly rest in God's presence. We create space for God to settle in our individual lives when we practice this intentional pausing. When we do this together, we make room in our communities for him. Better yet, we are a part of this new creation story, laying the groundwork for God to make his home, his resting place, right here.

### **Tell us about Joyful Seniors**


