Do you find it hard to understand the bible?

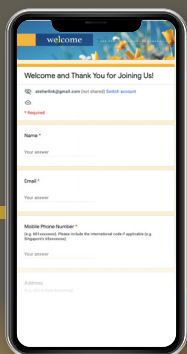
Hard to get what it's trying to say?

"Everyone can interpret the bible personally already what...the bible means whatever it means to you on a personal level."

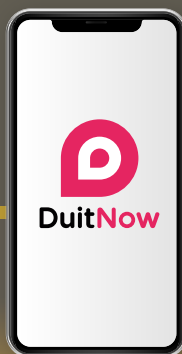
However, that statement is wrong.

letter what it means? Or should we ask the writer what it means?

The writer of course! He is the person who has something to say, and we should figure out what he has to say, and not just defer it to the reader to “tembak” whatever the meaning of the letter is.

Here is a scenario of a personal interpretation gone wrong.

Health Minister:

“(1) Covid is seriously fatal and vaccines can help. (2) We should all get jabbed.”

Bad Interpreter:

“Oh! Sentence 2 says ‘We should all get jabbed.’ To me, this means I should get high on drugs!”

In the scenario above, the message from the health minister is to get vaccinated, but the bad interpreter used one of his sentences, without context, to support his own pleasure. The health minister would not be happy because not only did the person miss the message, but has also misused his saying to support another idea that was not in his mind when he said that sentence.

If the health minister is alive, he can come out and clarify what he means and correct or rebuke the bad interpreter. Unfortunately, none of the authors or writers of the books in the bible are alive for us to interview them, but they left a lot of clues behind.

There are many clues and methods available and the biblical interpretation course with Dr. Kyle Essary will guide you through them. Examples of the clues are, what was the culture like? What did the words mean in their original language? Is the passage a song, a letter, or a story? What did the message mean to the original hearers?
