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

1. Sincerity

⁹ Love must be sincere. (Gk. Anypokritos)

> = Without hypocrisy, genuine, real

"If love is the sum of virtue and hypocrisy is the epitome of vice, what a contradiction to bring the two together." ~John Murray



2. Discernment

⁹...Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. (*Gk. Apostygeo*)

(only here)
= to shrink from with
abhorence, to detest

"The issue here is not the consequence of evil. A truly good man passionately hates evil because of what evil is not because of what he'll get if he does it. He hates it because it is his holy nature. He hates it because God hates it and he loves God"

2. Discernment

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= to shrink from with
abhorence, to detest

= to stick/bond as if with glue

3. Affection

¹⁰ Be devoted to one another in love. (*Gk. Philostorgos*) (*Gk. Philadelphia*)

(only here) = tenderly affectionate, as in family love, eg between parent and child = brotherly/sisterly love

4. Honour

¹⁰ Honor one another above yourselves (*Gk. Ti-me*) (*Gk. Proegoemai*)

Giving someone real value and worth = leading onwards or preceding

Phil 2:3-4 - "...in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others."

5. Enthusiasm

¹¹ Never be lacking (Gk. Okneros) in zeal, (Gk. Spoude) = slothful, slow Cf v8 = diligence

but keep your spiritual fervor, (Gk. Zeo)

serving the Lord. (*Gk. douleuo*)

= (lit.) to boil, to be fiery hot



¹² Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, (*Gk. hypomeno*) = enduring faithful in prayer.

1 Cor 13:4 - "Love is patient...

7. Generosity

¹³ Share with the Lord's people (*Gk. koinoneo*) who are in need.

= have in common, share, participate

8. Hospitality

¹³ Practice hospitality (Gk. Dioko) (Gk. Philoxenia)

= pursue earnestly

= kindness to

strangers





9. Good Will

¹⁴ Bless those who persecute you; (*Gk. Eulogeo*) (*Gk. Dioko*)

= Pursue with malignity

bless and do not curse.

Mt 5:44 – "But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you...."

10. Sympathy

¹⁵ Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn.

1 Cor 13:4 - "...Love does not envy...."



¹⁶ Live in harmony with one another. (Gk. Phroneo to auto)

=(Lit.) Think the same thing

Phil 2:2 "..then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind.

12. Humility

¹⁵ Do not be proud, (Gk. Hypselos) = Arrogant, lofty thoughts

but be willing to associate with people of low position. Do not be conceited. =Wise in your

(Gk. Phronimos)

⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: ⁶ Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; ⁷ rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death even death on a cross!

²¹ Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.






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
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
