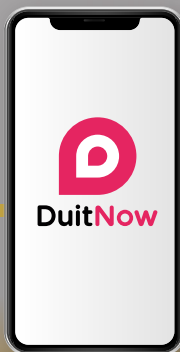
Featuring Sermon-Inspired Arts by the YOUTH

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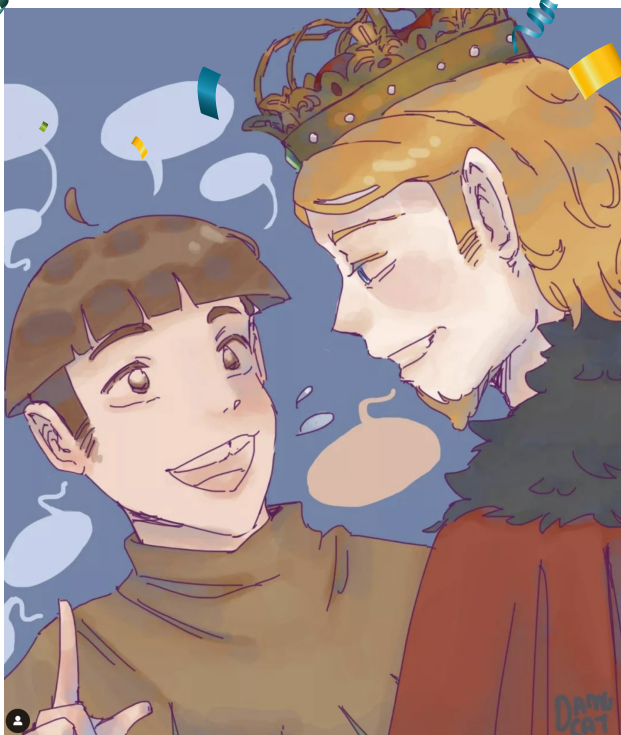
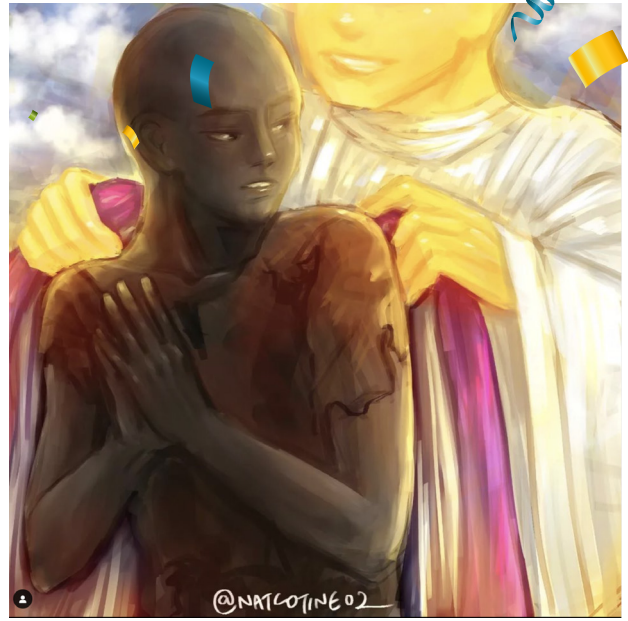
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Parable of the Wedding Banquet || 22nd May 2022 Sermon Recap

Jesus tells us that only someone who loves Him above everything else deserves eternal life.

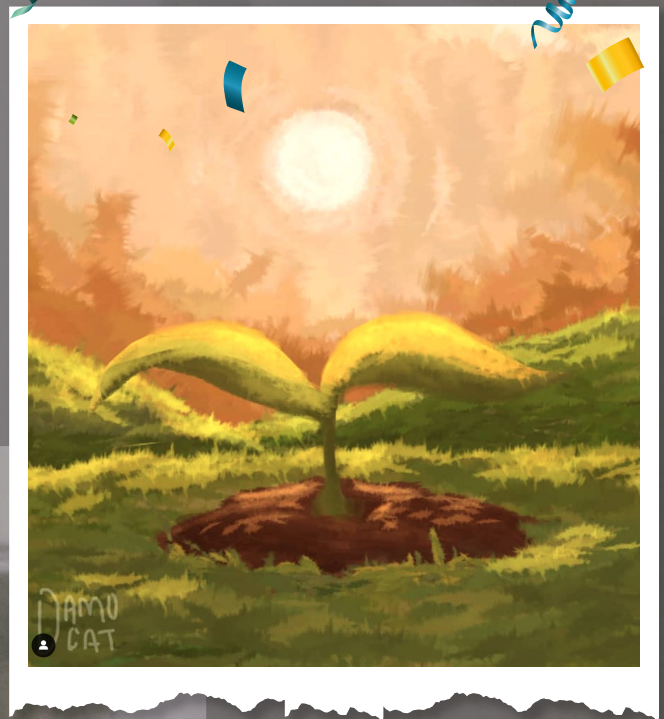

A lot of the time, when someone does us wrong or hurts us, we find it in our nature to not choose to forgive.

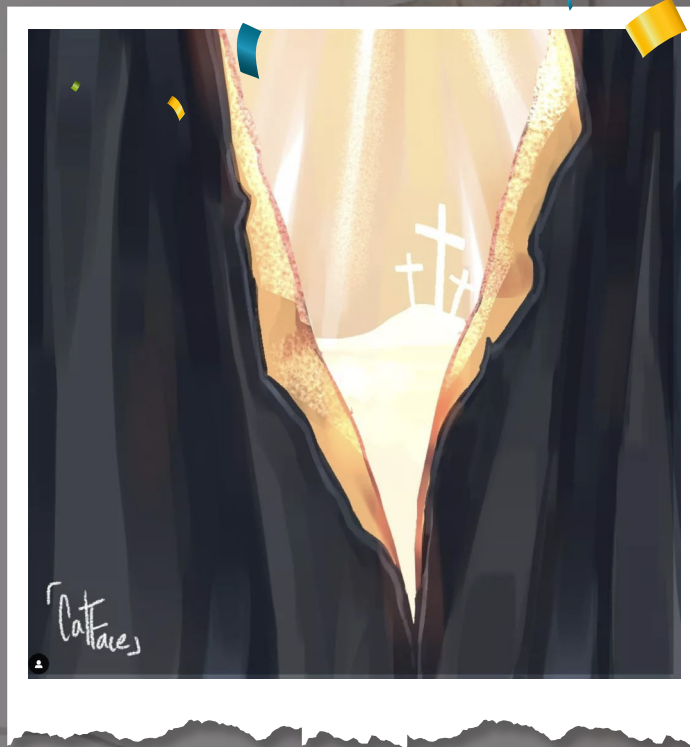
Instead, we may choose to gossip about them to other people or even act out in revenge against them. We feel like "oh, after they do this, then only I will forgive them".

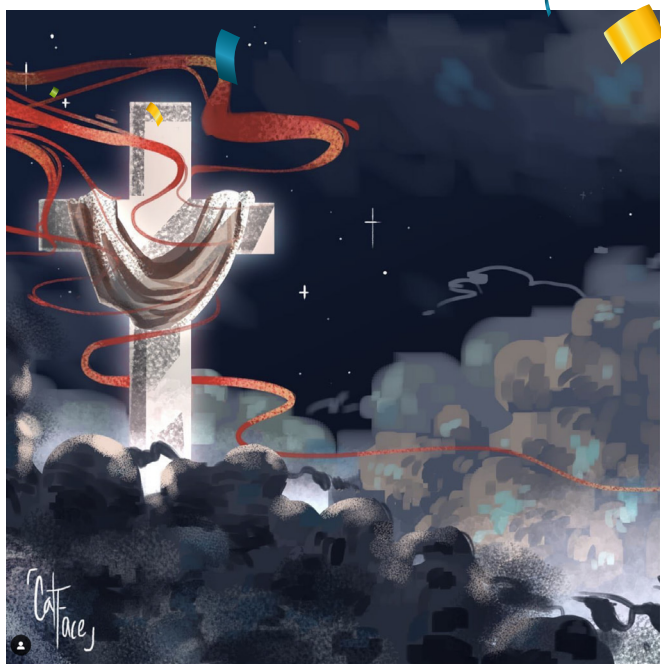
So, let us encourage each other to practice true forgiveness; to be a peacemaker, to forgive without limit, and to lean unto God's strength and patience.

The big question is: Are you ready to surrender your life to God?



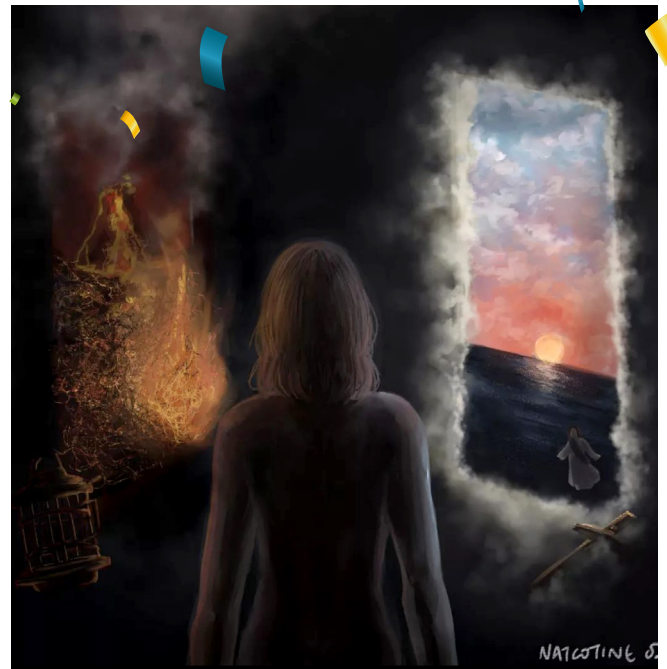
Which door would you choose?

Haven Ministry Prayer Items

1.
