FBC Burmese Education Outreach Program Mid 2022 Update

In August 2021, during the height of the second wave of the Covid-19 pandemic, FBC was connected to the Burmese refugee community living in Subang Jaya. Many of these refugees had lost their jobs due to lockdowns. FBC started an outreach to the Burmese refugees from the Zo tribe, providing monthly groceries and essentials for Zo refugee families staying at the Goodyear Courts.

Over the next few months, FBC was able to establish a relationship with Pastor Khai who serves as the pastor of the Zo Baptist Assembly where the Zo refugee families attend. As the economy opened up and the refugees returned to their jobs, FBC's grocery outreach likewise transitioned to the provision of education support for the Zo children. 

great as refugee children are not able to attend public schools or international schools due to their refugee status, limiting their options to private education programs which are often very costly. The lack of affordable options lead to many Burmese refugee children dropping out of school from a young age.

FBC responded generously to the fundraising for education support which was held over the Christmas 2021 season. The funds were pledged for provision of a full year support for 13 Burmese children.



FBC responded generously to the fundraising for education support which was held over the Christmas 2021 season. The funds were pledged for provision of a full year support for 13 Burmese children. With the education support, five Burmese children were able to enrol in FBC's Covenant Christian Center ("CCC") while a group of seven younger Burmese children enrolled in Tadika Sri Orchard. School fees, which comprehensively cover each child's education expenses, are paid directly to the education institutions on a termly basis, upon receipt of the attendance and progress report cards for each child.

As we got to know Pastor Khai better, we learned that he was very passionate about raising the literacy of the Burmese community, especially through Christian education. In March 2022, he decided to join CCC as a full-time volunteer as part of a 6 month training program. Currently, he is serving as liaison between CCC teachers and the Zo refugee students. He works closely with the teachers to understand teaching methods and receive hands-on training in the hope of setting up a similar learning center for the wider Zo community in the future.
