The study of the book of Genesis through the FBC pulpit as well as in BSF lessons has been a priceless and awesome journey for me. I am reminded that God has created me for a purpose. Nowadays I have learned to intentionally set aside time to be quiet and still so that I can hear His small voice

My days are more meaningful, joyful, and fulfilling now. I enjoy God's presence and experience His peace and joy even on bad days. I commune with Him throughout the day and tell Him everything big or small, knowing that He hears and cares.

During the Karis zoom meetings, I enjoy meeting new people and getting to know them, especially in the breakout groups. I am learning to see each person as uniquely created by God in His image and through the lens of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit also convicted me of my selfishness and unwillingness to get out of my comfort zone. I have much time to reflect on the bountiful blessings I have enjoyed. I realize that God has blessed me so that I can be a channel of blessing. I am learning to serve God willingly, cheerfully, and sacrificially.

I thank God for the opportunity to facilitate the Sisters in Christ sharing and prayer meetings during the pandemic.

A group of ladies met via zoom every Saturday to discuss the Sunday sermons and to pray for one another. God knew what each of us needed and there was an intense hunger for Him and His Word.

Attendance every Saturday was very good and after each meeting, we came away very blessed. Initially, I struggled with my inadequacy and incompetence to facilitate the discussions. However, as I humbly asked God for wisdom and guidance, I have learned that I am just His instrument.
