Chinese New Yea

Chinese New Year (CNY) holds many fond childhood memories for me though the excitement over the day weans off with each passing year. For one, I remember CNY was the only time when we the children had the chance to indulge in F&N orange and sarsaparilla bottled drinks. I would relish every sip because I know I have to wait another year for that "luxury"!

CNY was the time when the women folk in the family would sweat over the flipping of kuih kapit molds over cut iron pipes filled with charcoal briquettes. At the end of each session, my fingertips would turn bright red from folding the kuih kapit into fan shapes and slapping them with a tin lid before they harden.



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Most traditional Chinese households including ours would adhere to the rituals linked to the CNY season (though over the years there was less compliance with those customs). Year in and year out, there is this frenetic rush to get everything in place for the CNY.

Since some of these rituals originated from the predominant agro-based lifestyle of the Chinese in China, they may not have much relevance here actually. But it was a way of remembering our ancestral roots. I pondered over these traditions and found that I could draw some parallels to the Christian faith. The basic concept of the CNY's celebration is a renewal, closing off the old, and welcoming the new. So here are just a few parallels.

All the rituals of out with the old things and in with the new, and even the act of putting on new clothes, and shoes (and a new haircut as well) could be likened to putting off the old self and putting on the new self. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" (2 Corinthians 5:17). That's easier said than done!



Old habits are in housekeeping or CNY spring cleaning term – like dust. They keep returning. After getting rid of all the dust, they return three weeks later in clumps of fuzzy balls around the furniture legs or in wispy tendrils dangling from the ceilings and walls. That's why we need to spring clean ourselves not once a year but regularly to keep old habits from returning.



Apostle Paul tells us in Ephesians 3:16-19 Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide of Christ, and to know this love that of God." That is our true riches!

In Chinese tradition, all debts are to be cleared, otherwise, the debtor will be in debt for the whole year. Accumulated debt is particularly a no-no for Chinese businessmen. We may not have monetary debt but we carry a lot of other types of debts and burdens accumulated throughout each year. So let's clear out our debts of grudges, bitterness, and other negative traits and start on a clean slate.

The custom of wearing red for prosperity and giving out ang pows (red packets) symbolizes good fortune. Red is also the color of the gift from God. It is the color of the shed blood of Jesus Christ on the Cross. It is the Father's greatest ang pow to all His children by paving the way for a "reunion" with Him and is given the whole year round to all – whether you are a child or adult, single or married. How you choose to celebrate the CNY - whether you still adhere to the traditions or not - let's not forget this important thing. While farmers in China prepare and plant new seeds on their land at the start of spring, Christians can also prepare and plant Gospel seeds at the reunion table, and the days that follow. The "fields" are your immediate family members, your relatives, friends, school or office friends. So share the gospel with others this CNY spring.
