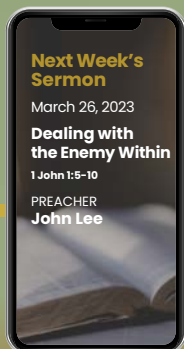

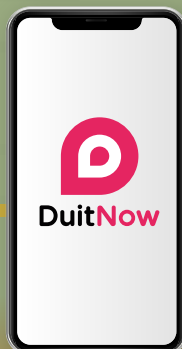
### Objectives of FBC SOUP KITCHEN
