

As facilitators of the Sisters in Christ Discipleship Life Group, it is our desire to provide women a place to develop their faith and grow in spiritual maturity through the discipline of bible study, prayer, and service by sharing insights from one another's experiences. We thank God for His faithfulness in leading, sustaining, and providing for us throughout the pandemic. From March 2020 till September 2021, we had our SIC Sharing and Prayer meetings via zoom every Saturday from 10 am –12 noon. From October 2021 onwards we change our zoom meetings to the first and third Saturday of the month.

Each meeting starts with an opening prayer and an opening song. Then we break out into two groups for our

Sharing and Prayer session. In the breakout group, we read the scripture and discuss a set of questions based on the Sunday sermon. Everyone is encouraged to participate and share what they have learned from the scripture and the sermon. As facilitators, we are often amazed at how our Living God speaks to each of us very differently and yet appropriately. Indeed He is our Creator God. He knows our needs and we are at different stages in our walk with Him. The questions are designed to help us reflect on what God wants to teach us and how we can apply the lessons learned from the sermons. As we share and listen to one another with open minds and receptive humble hearts, we come away from the discussion very refreshed and blessed. At the end of each breakout session, we share our joys and struggles freely knowing that our sharing is with a family of sisters who love us and are not judgmental and everything shared is confidential. Our prayer for all SIC members is that we will have a hunger for God's Word and we will be transformed by it. We remind one another to have a close and intimate relationship with God and to love Him wholeheartedly and to give Him top priority in all aspects of our lives.
