James 2:14-26

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.

But someone will say, "You have faith; I have deeds."

Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds. You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that—and shudder.

You foolish person, do you want evidence that faith without deeds is useless? Was not our father Abraham considered righteous for what he did when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? You see that his faith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did. And the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness," and he was called God's friend. You see that a person is considered righteous by what they do and not by faith alone.

In the same way, was not even Rahab the prostitute considered righteous for what she did when she gave lodging to the spies and sent them off in a different direction? As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead.



Takeaway

Even though we are saved by faith not works, works are evidence of authentic faith. So Christians who have little or no fruits or labour of love have to check whether their root is healthy planted to God, our source of love.

Case Study

Case 1 – Works produced by Faith

Janine Leong goes to Third Baptist Church, and is a financially independent woman in her forties. She hangs around middle-class friends in church and rarely met any poor people personally.

Then she decided to volunteer in Soup Kitchen and Hopeful Ministry and met a lot of people who came to her with financial need.

1) a) Discussion question. Below are a list of people Janine met.

Case 1.1 – Ah Hock

The first person Janine met is called Ah Hock. Ah Hock said he is in financial need. When asked on the details of the financial need, he says he needs money to renew his Astro subscription. He says that the Astro subscription is to keep his elderly parents occupied at home.

i) If you are Janine, would you help Ah Hock?

Case 1.2 – Benny

Janine met Benny. Benny is a working man and the sole bread winner of his family. He says he needs money to invest in BeatCoins. He says it has potential to see returns in a month's time and he just need some help for the capital to invest so he can feed his family.

ii) If you are Janine, would you help Benny?

Case 1.3 – Christine

Janine met Christine. Christine says that her newborn baby cannot tolerate normal milk or even breast milk and need a specially formulated milk. She needs money to buy that milk.

iii) If you are Janine, would you help Christine?

Case 1.4 – Deva

Janine met Deva. Deva works as a part time maid in an office. She says she needs money to buy stationeries, school uniform and shoes for her 6 kids for the new school semester.

iv) If you are Janine, would you help Deva?

Case 1.5 – Edwin

Janine met Edwin. He says he has mouth cancer and needs money for the treatment. He wants to have the best treatment that is only available in China and needs money for the flight as well as the treatments from the private doctors there.

v) If you are Janine, would you help Edwin?

Case 1.6 – Fiona

Janine met Fiona. Fiona is an elderly lady who wants a second pair of dentures. She cried in front of Janine for an hour and says she eats rice with sauces every day and had no money to buy meat and vegetables because she has no income.

Janine decided to bring Fiona to a government dental clinic and paid RM50 to make a new pair of dentures. When the dentist asked Fiona what was wrong with the current dentures, she said it was loose and caused her trouble chewing meat and vegetables.

vii) Discussion question. What is the apostle James expecting from us in terms of helping out the poor? Is it too much?
