Examples of Gaslighting in a Relationship

- Distracting with compassion sugarcoating toxic situations and making their partner feel like they're overreacting
- Minimizing of making fun of feelings calling partners overly sensitive, critical, or dramatic
- Discounting achievements often questions various accomplishments
- Denying abuse sometimes they're so convincing that even the victim starts to believe their version of the truth
- Withholding information insisting they told their partner something when they never did



- Fighting sin requires godly wisdom
- We are often deceived by not knowing the full devastating impact of sin
- The key to fighting sin is deepening your relationship with Christ together with others.
- Changing the attitude of your minds is about having godly habits that will <u>slowly</u> change your heart.




