We go through our lives doing things. We all do things. But very few will do what they are created to do. I often tell myself that if I have to be the church toilet cleaner, the church should have the cleanest toilet in Subang Jaya (at least). The calling of God for a given individual is not only in the Billy Graham and Tim Keller types of this world but also in the most menial and unseen things. God sees and he knows our motivation and obedience. In fact, it would not surprise me if the largest crowns or rewards are eventually given to the most invisible, unknown, and "lowly" of believers... who through their simple but genuine faith, have impacted the kingdom of God in unimaginable and unrecorded ways.

Meeting the potential that God has created us for (like the Pusher) may mean something that we cannot even imagine. The real question is... how badly do we want it?
