Interview with Pari

How many years has it been since you first said "yes" to serving God with your life? What has encouraged you to persevere and what has been the anchor of your joy through life's struggles and through the disapproval from family?

» It has been almost 27 years since I stepped into missions with Operation Mobilization (OM). I remember really wrestling with God for a whole year cause I was reluctant to go into missions and let go of my career. Yet looking back, that period of praying, asking God



questions, reading the Word and talking with mature believers helped me know God's call on my life. So over the years in the good and the tough seasons, knowing God has called and that this is his work helps me persevere and not quit.

God is my anchor. Despite the many years of ministry, some of my family are still disapproving and that is hard and sometimes painful. But my identity is based on who God says I am. So I have to keep turning to God and remind myself that in God I am enough.

You are a missionary but currently based in your home country. How have people received that? What struggles do people take for granted since you're "home"?

» The work of missions requires not only the front liners who do the evangelism, church planting, etc. Those ministries cannot take place without a team of workers doing finance, personnel and mobilizing. To develop the ministry and the workers, we need training, coaching, mentoring, financial development, people care and leadership. Yet most of these functions in missions are behind the scenes and often not spoken about and much less recognized. Also many of the matters that I handle are confidential and sensitive and need to be covered in prayer, yet cannot be spoken about.

My roles in OM has me away from home a lot. Hence I am not able to be present at church or even relate to the church family consistently. So the challenge is a sense of belonging and of being 'sent' by the church.

You've invested a lot in teens and young adults, and that's something many of your age struggle with. Would you have any encouragement or advice for those desiring to mentor younger people or break the 'generation gaps'?

» Simply love them, listen, encourage and affirm the next generation. Don't judge. Be open to learn from each other. We older ones can learn much from the younger ones. Be transparent, allow them to see how we navigate life (the highs and lows) with God. They don't need to 'know' more about how, they need to see it in action up close.

Also I don't see the next gen as the future of the church because they are already the church of today. Along with us the older ones, together we are the church today. I think this is important to wrestle with before our interaction can be genuine.

To overcome the generation gap all generations should try to practice the above. It can't be one sided. Mentoring is a two way relationship, not top down, rather side by side.

The mentor is one who has walked the Jesus follower journey a bit further, and has a bit more history with God. The mentee, has a desire to grow in his or her journey. As they journey together the Holy Spirit works. Both learn and grow together.
