





- 2 narrow seasons in which rain will come
- Early and latter rains autumn and spring rains

- Does not just wait for rain, but waits for the fruit end result
- The harvest is the end of the rain and the reaping of the fruit

Love Covers a Multitude of Sins



- Proverbs 10:12 Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins.
- 1 Peter 4:8 (NKJV) And above all things have fervent love for one another, for "LOVE WILL COVER A MULTITUDE OF SINS."
- Proverbs 19:11 The discretion of a man deferreth his anger; and it is his glory to pass over a transgression.

Love Covers a Multitude of Sins



- Personal slights, snide or ignorant remarks, minor annoyances, insensitivities, people letting us down
- If we call them out every time
 - Community is going to break down
 - We will have nobody
 - And we are going to be lonely
- Because everyone else is just like you
 - Same fears
 - Same problems
 - Same insecurities
 - Same distractions

Love Covers a Multitude of Sins



- A person who knows how to cover a multitude of sins
 - Learn to be patient
 - Learn the discipline
 - Not grumbling inside/outside
 - Not calling them out
 - Learn not to dwell on things when people have wronged you
- Emphathise
 - What about me?
 - Who knows what that person is going through?

Why does God put us in a church?



 Hebrews 10:25 - "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together ..."

Note: Love covers a multitude of sins (1 Peter 4:8) What it means and what it does <u>not</u> mean

- To "cover" sin is to forgive it forgiveness is associated with love
- Love covering sin is <u>not</u> sweeping matters under the rug.
 - Some have appealed to the forgiving nature of love in their attempt to hide indiscretion.
 - For example, rather than report child abuse, a church might cover it up. This is <u>not</u> what true love does.
 - Love protects by helping both the victim and the offender, and it also strives to prevent further offenses.
- Love covering sin is <u>not</u> disregarding our own emotions or ignore our personal boundaries.
 - We cannot "cover" sin by denying that it hurt us.
 - We cover sin by <u>acknowledging</u> it and then <u>extending the forgiveness</u> God has given us to others.



- Unless we know how love covers a multitude of sins

- Suffering
 - Real losses
 - Real griefs
- 2 examples suffered and persevered in suffering
 - The Prophets
 - Job



- Does not mean not letting our suffering get to us
- Does not mean we are without emotion



- Patience in suffering means we do not get self absorbed



- Suffering wins when we go into ourselves (self-absorbed):
 - "I cannot pray"
 - "I cannot help people"
 - "I cannot get out"
 - "I cannot do these things"



- Suffering wins when we go into ourselves (self-absorbed):
 - "I cannot pray"

- Does not mean incredible inner poise
- Does mean that we do not let suffering turn us into self absorbed beings – that it's all about me
