At that time, the interpretation of the law was ambiguous. "To love a neighbour" required clarification because context, circumstances, relationships, laws and a multiplicity of other factors have been bearing on how people might interact with others. Who the neighbour might be is a good ethical and religious question.

During the time of Jesus, the 25 km-long road from Jerusalem to Jericho was notorious for its danger and difficulty, and was known as the Way of Blood because of the **blood** which is **often** shed there by robbers.

LUKE 10:31-33


31 A **priest** *happened* to be going down the *same* road, and when he <u>saw</u> the man, he *passed* by on the other side.

32 So too, a Levite, when he *came* to the place and <u>saw</u> him, *passed* by on the other side.


33 **But** a **Samaritan**, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he **saw** him, **he took pity on him**.

ISAIAH 53:2-6


