Persistent Prayer in Community: Miller urges the importance of consistent, communal prayer within a church. This may call for a shift in priorities and a deeper commitment to collective spiritual growth.

Overall, "A Praying Church" offers a refreshing perspective on prayer, providing practical guidance for believers seeking a deeper, more meaningful connection with God. The author's friendly and compassionate writing style made this book an invaluable resource for my desire to cultivate a richer prayer life.
