1. In your own words, how would you describe youth camp?

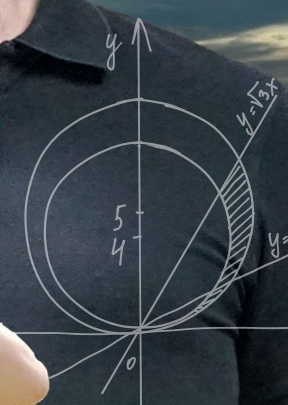
I would describe it as an experience that is very memorable and one-of-a-kind.

I was amazed to see them touched by the Spirit, worshipping and praying as if the whole room was just God and them. Many nonchristians were also exposed to the Christian faith in this way too. All of this made me feel like how Paul felt about the Phillipian church - joy.

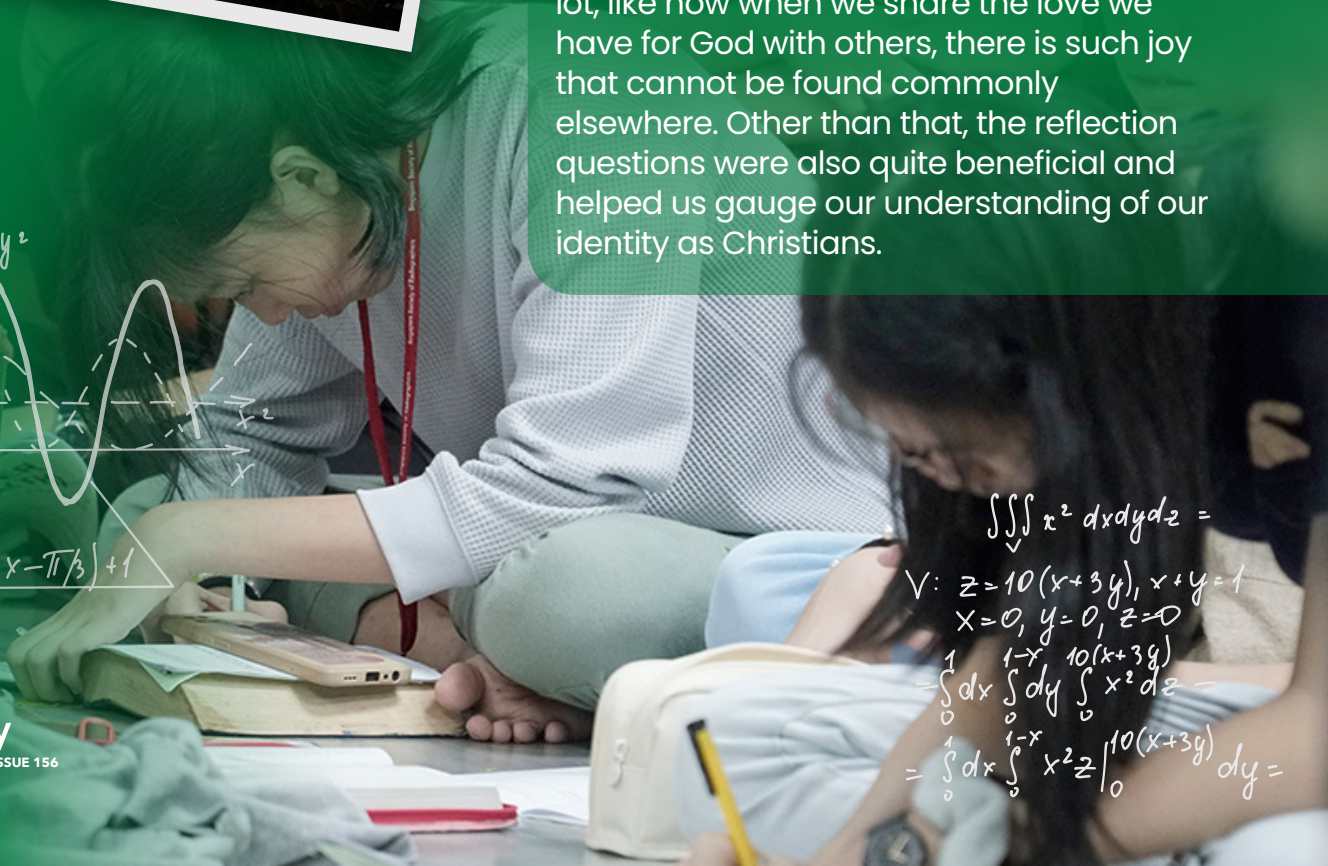

The session that impacted me the most was the first session, talking about the Gospel-Driven Partnership. Pastor Tim spoke about how Paul felt love and joy towards the Philippian church, and he prayed for them even in his lowest moments.

He also laid down what it meant to be gospel partners, our gospel-driven identity, and how to pray for one another. It really set the foundation of how we as the church should support one another. I find myself relating to the sermon quite a lot, like how when we share the love we have for God with others, there is such joy that cannot be found commonly elsewhere. Other than that, the reflection questions were also quite beneficial and helped us gauge our understanding of our identity as Christians.

Pastor Tim preached about proclaiming Christ despite rejection and hurt, dying and living for the gospel, as well as prioritizing the gospel. It was definitely a big jump from the first session, but a necessary one. "To live is Christ and to die is gain" was the main takeaway from the sermon, and as hard as it is to practice on a daily basis, it

serves the purpose of reminding us that living a gospel-driven life is full of hardships. However, with the knowledge that we can glorify God in all things we do, it gives us purpose and joy.
