Study 4: Distortions of the Gospel

1. What are the various ways in which the gospel is distorted and why do all these distortions matter to us? Gospel, Legalism and Antinomianism; look at our own lives right now, which of the three are we most tempted to be living out? Discuss
2. What is the ultimate aim of the gospel? If this is the case, doesn't it sound rather egotistical of God?
3. What does Col 3:3-7 say about the gospel? What must crucially occur for us to bear fruit by the gospel?
4. How does the gospel produce the motivation for spiritual transformation? Can you share from your own life what motivates you to grow spiritually? What evidence in your own life reassures you that your faith is truly gospel centered and authentic?
5. How does the gospel enable us to see ourselves, God, others, and the world in a different light. Share with your group how the gospel has changed your perspectives in life?
6. We can distort the gospel by religiosity or irreligion, why do we tend to do so?
7. If spiritual transformation accompanies authentic gospel centered faith in Christ, What is the role of our own hard work, discipline and sacrifice? Can Jesus save us if we accept Him only as Saviour but not as Lord?
