Admittedly at the beginning, I was shy to connect since I had lost touch with what it was to be in fellowship with church members. Still, each person in Kairos has humbled me with their friendliness and acceptance, disregarding color and

background. What to me started as an obligation to serve, has now become an anticipated weekly fellowship with lots of fun and blessings.

MCO has definitely impacted my social side and on top of being an extreme workaholic, I was going through a lot of personal issues which kept me from serving for the longest time, but something about being in Kairos made me realize just how much I have missed being in church and serving the Lord, and this has also reminded me how important it is to have **God-Fearing people around** me, to support in prayer and to talk about God, in the process, also my inner healing has started to take place.





In this one year since Kairos first started, I have seen growth, not only in numbers, but in love and bonding with each other as a family brought together by the Lord under this ministry.

We have even planned meet-ups and "lepak" sessions outside of Kairos such as badminton and dinners, and are also exploring other fun activities to spend more time with each other. I think one thing really wonderful about everyone here is that we all have a teachable spirit and are passionate to learn about God. The testimonies of how the Lord has brought us through our darkest moments and even experienced the miracles of God in our lives truly an immense encouragement of what an Amazing God we serve.

I have attended many churches, but the one significant difference I see that sets Kairos apart for me is the very fact that the activities, the way it is run and the programs somehow create a safe space for us to be at ease, raise in us a desire and want to actively participate and serve, to reach out and to step up.

Truly, I can see the Lord working in this Ministry, and for me, it is indeed a privilege and blessing to be in Kairos.
