AG Emmanuel Private Home Care is one of the caregiver services here in Malaysia, specializing in providing care for elderly patients with ADLs, Stroke, Cancer, Dementia, Colostomy, Trichotomy, and Parkinson's Disease. The care is administered by certified caregivers who have the knowledge to perform NGT and PEG feeding, among other services. In addition to their professional duties, they also provide physical and emotional support to patients and their families. Notably, many of the caregivers in this nursing home are Filipinos.

A member of our ministry who is a caregiver mentioned that a nursing home was seeking people from Churches to provide visitation and prayers for their patients. We feel blessed to have been approached about this opportunity. We immediately visited the nursing home in Puchong to see what we could do. They gave us a warm welcome to their place and we immediately got to know the caretakers, Annie and Grace. And we also had the chance to meet the patients currently staying in the nursing home. Some of them are bedridden,

while others are receiving care due to their old age. One thing crossed my mind: What prayers could we offer for these elderly patients in this place?"

As we learned more, I felt saddened by their circumstances. Each has their own story, others accept Jesus Christ and others do not, but they all share the commonality of not having their loved ones around and accepting that their life may be nearing its end.

Recognizing that our time can be daunting, especially for the elderly. They often feel neglected, seeking a source of joy, and their hope decreases as the days pass. And I found in Isaiah 46:4.

"Even to your old age, I am He, And even to gray hairs I will carry you! I have made, and I will bear; Even I will carry, and will deliver you."



What exquisite words we can share with elderly individuals! This revelation has shown me that sharing the Gospel with the elderly is crucial, offering them the opportunity to accept Jesus Christ and find eternal life in Him even at this moment. It's never too late to help deepen their faith and spiritual growth, reminding them that God's love for us is boundless and that He offers a source of joy and hope (Romans 15:13) that surpasses all circumstances. This realization has moved me to understand that sharing the Gospel with the elderly fulfills the Great Commission given by Jesus to us' ...to go and make disciples of all nations' (Matthew 28:19-20). It is a fundamental aspect of Christian obedience to share the good news of salvation with people
