1 Corinthians 12:1-26

1 Corinthians 12:7-8 (NIV)

Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. 8 To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit,

On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, 23 and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it,

Case Study

Case 1 – Gifts of Healing and Miracles

The Real Jesus Church promises that Jesus can do anything and will provide miracles of gift and healing as seen in some New Testament passages.

1. a) Discussion question. Which Bible passages would you point to indicate that healing doesn't happen all the time even in the bible?

- b) Reflection question. Recall and share any healing testimonies from people who have shared them, was there one where Down Syndrome was completely reversed and even the face and behaviour of the patient became completely normal?
- c) Discussion question. How should we think and pray about healing?
- d) Discussion question. A person who used to attend Real Jesus Church starts attending your life group and promotes healing rallies organised by the previous church to your group members. What would you do?

Case 2 – Gifts of Speaking in Tongues

Charis May came from a Pentecostal Church that practises speaking in tongues and even has training sessions to train people how to speak in tongues. She then changed to First Baptist Church.

2. a) Discussion question. What exactly is speaking in tongues? (Refer to the supplementary reading below)

Supplementary Reading

- Early church fathers like Gregory of Nazianzus (c. 329–390), John Chrysostom (c. 344–407), Augustine, and notable Christians like John Calvin (1509-1564), Puritans such as Jonathan Edwards, Charles Spurgeon, and Charles Hodge believe the tongues refer to languages.
- Acts 2:4 (ESV) And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.
- Acts 2:6-8 (ESV) And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language?
- **1 Corinthians 14:9-11** (ESV) So with yourselves, if with your tongue you utter speech that is not intelligible, how will anyone know what is said? For you will be speaking into the air. There are doubtless many different languages in the world, and none is without meaning, but if I do not know the meaning of the language, I will be a foreigner to the speaker and the speaker a foreigner to me.

Case 2.1 – Gifts of Speaking in Tongues

Charis started to speak in tongues in the form of Glossolalia during a prayer meeting at First Baptist Church.

One of the leaders pulled her aside after the prayer ended and said we don't practice public speaking in tongues and asked her to refrain from doing so next round. Charis felt embarrassed and confused because that was what she had learned in her previous church for decades. She then got upset at the person and then the church for not being spiritual enough, and that her church was more open to the Holy Spirit because everyone there had the gift of tongues.

b) Discussion question. What are the facts against Charis' statement that presupposes all Christians should have the gift of tongues? (Glossolalia explain in supplementary reading below but anyone in your group from a Charismatic background can share their experience and explanation)

Supplementary Reading

"Glossolalia consists of strings of meaningless syllables made up of sounds taken from those familiar to the speaker and put together more or less haphazardly. The speaker controls the rhythm, volume, speed and inflection of his speech so that the sounds emerge as pseudolanguage—in the form of words and sentences.

Glossolalia is language-like because the speaker unconsciously wants it to be language-like. Yet in spite of superficial similarities, glossolalia fundamentally is not language.
