

1 Corinthians 15:35 (ESV) But someone will ask, "**How** are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?"

There are heavenly bodies and earthly bodies, but the glory of the heavenly is of one kind, and the glory of the earthly is of another.










GLORY OF THE MOON

SIR RANULPH FIENNES "THE WORLD'S GREATEST LIVING EXPLORER".


First and only person to circumnavigate the whole planet through both the north and south pole. 1993 first man to WALK across the whole continent of Antarctica, unsupported He suffered a severe heart attack and 4 months later he ran 7 marathons in 7 continents in 7 days for the **British heart foundation.** He also ran a 156-kilometer ultramarathon through the Sahara desert. He was 71 when he accomplished it.

Natural sequence

1 Corinthians 15:45-46 (ESV) Thus it is written, "The first man Adam became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. 46 But it is not the spiritual that is first but the natural, and then the spiritual.

WHAT IS SPIRITUAL BODY

44 It is sown a natural body; it is raised a **spiritual body.** If there is a natural body, there is also a **spiritual body**.

Luke 24:38-39 (ESV) And he said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? 39 See my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me, and see. For a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have."
