

Pastor Titus and Lola (grandma) Beth would periodically crack jokes to us and the people we ministered to. There would be laughters every day where they are. Lola Beth would accompany us during the work, even though her knees would be in pain and she would need to rest from time to time, her determination was inspiring to watch. Amy was very easy going and always had a smile on her face, answering our questions and sharing stories with us, whether that was her time in Malaysia and her love for

basically our CCTV on the trip, taking photos and videos of us doing the activities with the kids and the senior citizens. She sat behind me in the van. I called her my "neighbour" and would squeeze my between the window and the headrest to have conversations with her during our long rides. Rhoro was the sunflower of the group; she would help translate our instructions to the children in Tagalog in her

beautiful voice when she sang a Tagalog song for our team member Lily's birthday. She also takes super-duper good photos of me. All these people I see as an extension of my family in Christ, and I developed a bond with them and will think of them from time to time.

THE POVERTY

Poverty was just a concept to me. I grew up with enough, and only heard of starving children in Africa when I didn't finish my rice at meal times. Rhoro was a previously sponsored kid and shared her testimony last year in FBC as well. She mentioned that she grew up eating rice with coffee or rice with salt. Sometimes they get a can of food that they would need to share between the five siblings with the rice. Mind you, she is only in her twenties. I only heard of such stories during my father's younger days when he had to eat rice with sugar or Milo because

they couldn't afford meat or vegetables. Also, when we borrowed the restroom of the local pastors in a rural area, there was no electricity or running water system; we only had pails of water that were manually pumped from underground, and we had to use the toilet in the dark. The house of the pastor had no tiles or cement, so we just walked in with our shoes. I think I basically time-traveled to the time when my dad was young. When I ministered to the senior citizens, a lot of the prayer needs were financial provision and good health. They would describe health conditions they are currently having, and if this were back in Malaysia, I'd just suggest that they see a doctor, but to a lot of them, it is not an affordable expense. I would just pray for them. Some other requests I would receive were a mother requesting prayers for his son, who is in prison, and another mother's plea, who wants to have enough provisions for her kids to study well and grow up healthy.





On the 9th May 1912, William Booth spoke these stirring words in his final address to thousands of Salvationists at the Royal Albert Hall in London:

"WHILE WOMEN WEEP AS THEY DO NOW, I'LL FIGHT; WHILE LITTLE CHILDREN GO HUNGRY AS THEY DO NOW, I'LL FIGHT; WHILE MEN GO TO PRISION, IN AND OUT, IN AND OUT, AS THEY DO NOW, I'LL FIGHT; WHILE THERE IS A DRUNKARD LEFT, WHILE THERE IS A POOR LOST GIRL UPON THE STREETS, WHILE THERE REMAINS ONE DARK SOUL WITHOUT THE LIGHT OF GOD, I'LL FIGHT - I'LL FIGHT TO THE VERY END!"

I think one important ministry of Christianity is that we fight to bring a bit of heaven down to earth. We bring light and hope and glimpses of heaven and goodness and kindness into the lives of people who are less fortunate and in need. When we were distributing the rice and canned food to the senior citizens, many of them were extremely grateful. I could see it in their eyes, the joy reaching their hearts. They would come to us and shake our hands firmly with gratitude, some even hugged and kissed the cheeks of some of the team members. One lady teared up when I prayed for her, she said she felt my prayers even though I had no translators at that time. I only prayed a simple prayer, I believe it was the Lord's work of touching her heart, and I was merely a vessel, at the right place, at the right time.



KAPATID MINISTRY CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM

One of the works Kapatid Ministry does is the child sponsorship program. They look for sponsors who would sponsor a kid, which covers School Supplies, School Uniforms, School Fees, School Projects, etc. I just started to sponsor a child from the Kapatid Ministry this year and was assigned to a child named Mily. When we were at the fellowship program with the sponsored kids, I happened to meet Mily! I greeted her without revealing my identity. I was told she travelled 2 hours from her church to come to the meeting place. Out of the 168 kids that are being sponsored, only around 40 kids came to meet us, so it seemed like a divine appointment! It is one thing to see a face on a 2D photo on WhatsApp, it is another when you see the child as a full-fledged human being who covers her face when she feels shy. I was told by my team member, who was in a

discussion group with her, that Mily is serving in Sunday school weekly and was shy in responding to her questions. I want to see her grow up healthy, mature, and also become another beam of light and hope to those around her.
