How It All Began

The Filipino Ministry at FBC Subang was born out of a vision — a vision planted in the hearts of my late brother, Titus Laxa, FBC's Mission they prayed earnestly for a ministry that would bring hope, encouragement, and the Gospel to Filipinos living in Malaysia.

As early as 1993, Filipino Bible Studies were already active — one in PBC led by Titus, and another here in FBC Subang, led by Wah See and myself. However, during the 1997 economic crisis, many of the Filipino domestic helpers had to return home. This led us to centralize our gatherings at Malaya Hotel, forming FCM (Filipino Ministry Malaysia) under the umbrella of FBC Pantai.

A New Chapter

In August 2013, God opened a new door. When my brother-in-law moved to Malaysia for work, we saw this as the perfect opportunity to reconnect with

Filipinos attending the main FBC Subang service. With Dr. Peter's blessing, we held our very first gathering at the Transit Lounge on August 11, 2013 — and the Filipino Ministry Subang was born.

Passing the Baton

In 2022, Pastor Louie and my sister returned to the Philippines for good, entrusting the ministry to Bro. Arwin and Bro. Leo — who continues to faithfully lead and shepherd our growing community.

Moving Forward in Faith

Today, the Filipino Ministry stands as a testimony of God's faithfulness. What began as a simple vision has grown into a vibrant community — rooted in prayer, united in mission, and committed to glorifying God and serving our fellow Filipinos here in Malaysia.
