

inalienable. You'll have to read the book to see what's in it, much like how you'll have to eat an orange to know whether it's sweet or sour.

The Bible is artificially divided into two Testaments, and there's a 400-year separation between the two. The Old Testament was written before Jesus came and the New Testament written after He came. The Old Testament contains several covenants but the New Testament only has one.

The word 'Bible' comes from the Greek word *Biblos*, which means 'Library'. That's because it is a collection of 66 books written by more than 40 writers over a period of 1400 years. And yet a common thread weaves through the pages: a holy God who loves the world but will punish sin. The Bible also contains the message that salvation is a free gift of God through Jesus Christ His Son.

The contents of the Bible make interesting reading as the authors come from different walks of lifelike kings, prime ministers, shepherds, and fishermen. You'll find different writing styles and genres too. But one thing you won't find is religion.

The Bible is anything but a book of "Thou Shall Nots". Except for the book of Leviticus, which contains instructions for the Old Testament priests, the rest of the 65 books are of history, civil and moral teachings, prophecy, poems, prayers, and letters.

Did you know that the Bible is the most hated book in history? It's because its message is revolutionary and radical. It challenges the norms of the world and the edicts of wicked tyrants and dictators.

Thousands of Christians have been martyred because of the Bible's call to righteousness. Many have been beheaded, crucified, burnt alive, shot, battered, and whipped to death. Bible translators are not spared either. Many have been executed for the "crime" of making the Bible available to common folk.

However, the Bible is also the world's most treasured book! Many kings, queens, and presidents have taken their oath of office by swearing on the Bible. At the January 2021 inauguration, the Vice President of the USA was seen to have been sworn in on two Bibles.

Today, the Bible is the best-selling book in the world. It outsells the next publication title by millions. The Guinness Book of World Records estimates that more than 5 billion copies of the Bible have been printed.

For Christians who read the Bible regularly, it is the fountain of understanding and wisdom; the foundation of everything that is decent and kind; the very seat of fairness and justice; the true cradle of civilization; the cornerstone of mercy and righteousness.

Why is the Bible so special? You'll have to read it to see for yourself. The inspired word of God must be experienced to know its worth, just like tasting that orange to know that it's sweet. Otherwise, you'll never know!

What is the Filipino Ministry's vision?

Our vision is to see fellow Filipinos encounter Christ, experience the saving and sanctifying grace of God the Father, be empowered by His Holy Spirit, resulting in the expansion of God's kingdom (4E's).

To support this objective, we are organizing activities such as seminars, training sessions, and monthly Bible quizzes to equip our members in the areas of evangelism, Bible knowledge, Bible teaching, and service.

Our regular church activities, namely Sunday Worship, Youth Group, and Kid's Ministry, are continuing online. Members are encouraged to follow up with newcomers and those who have been inactive. The Ministry is also supporting members through prayer, social concern initiatives, and the provision of technical assistance for those experiencing problems with Zoom. Last but not least, regular gatherings for Bible study are also being organized for members who have permanently returned to the Philippines.

How can FBC worshippers get involved with the Filipino Ministry?

Salvation is for all, and we are accountable to God in the sharing of the Good News to our household and beyond (Romans 10:11-17). As such, we hope that FBC worshippers who have Filipino helpers at home would support them in having a rest day on Sunday and encourage them to attend FBC's Filipino Sunday Worship Service. In this way, FBC worshippers would be taking care of their helpers' spiritual needs too.



Pastor Ramachandran Ramalingam went home to be with the Lord on 17 February 2021. He leaves behind a loving wife Patricia Mary, children Rakesh, Claire, and Navin, daughter-in-law Rubyn, and son-in-law Dr. Jiaganesh.

Many of us would have seen Pastor Rama on Sunday mornings as he stood at the door waiting to greet worshippers entering the worship hall. His deep but gentle voice could be heard too, as he often led the congregation to seek God's face in corporate prayer.

A member of FBC's pastoral team, Pastor Rama conducted wake and funeral services, wedding blessings, home visitations, Bible studies, and provided pastoral care. He was the ministry leader for Community Care (Social Concerns). He was involved in outreach efforts to the poor and marginalized communities through initiatives such as the Makarios Home, Street Feeding program, Special Teens Ministry, Kenosis Home (a drug rehabilitation home), Burning Bush (a drug rehabilitation home), Crisis Care Home (a HIV halfway house), Persatuan Kebajikan Cahaya Hidup Klang, My Father's Home @ Port Dickson, and was a committee member of Pertubuhan Iringan Kasih (a single mother's home).

Pastor Rama also led the work amongst the needy in the Sunway area, oversaw the Saturday tuition program for underprivileged children, and was instrumental in setting up the Tamil Ministry. His love for the Lord was truly exemplified in his passion for reaching out to the poor and marginalized.



STEP 1

Download the **ZOOM** application (app) from this <u>link</u>. Click the blue 'Download' button.

STEP 2

Install ZOOM by clicking the 'ZOOMinstaller.exe' file that appears on the bottom left of screen. When the download is complete, the ZOOM app will open automatically.




STEP 3

Alternatively, you can click on the specific meeting link that will be provided in FBC Today on 14 March.


