A Tribute To Our Mothers

Mother's Day must be one of the most celebrated days in our calendar. That's because few would argue against the importance and the impact that mothers have on their children, irrespective of whether they are Christian or not.

For most of us, our earliest and fondest memories may be those of our mother's sacrificial love,

expressed through their care and concern when we were sick. For others, it could be the way our mothers toiled day after day to cook, wash and clean so the rest of the family's physical needs were well taken care of. And then there were the times of sadness and emotional traumas that we invariably go through in life that only the empathy of a mother could understand and seek to comfort.

The Bible in Proverbs 31:27-29 says as much about the virtuous woman who is both a good wife and a mother:

"She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness. Her children arise and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her: Many women do noble things, but you surpass them all."

The portrait from these verses describes a woman who is **selfless** and **hardworking**. In fact, it's hard to overestimate the sacrifice that a mother makes for her child. Almost as soon as a woman has conceived, her maternal instinct takes over to care for the foetus in her. I witnessed that first hand when my wife Cynthia was bearing our twin daughters.

I remember her singular focus on adhering to a strict diet, abstaining from any food or drink that may even remotely be considered harmful to the babies within her. As she also suffered from a rare form of thrombosis which increased her chances of life-threatening blood clot during pregnancy, she had to be given an injection of anticoagulant every single day until the babies were born. Most days, I had the unpleasant task of administering the needle. It was clear to me as I saw her unflinching resolve to go through the pain for her yet unborn children, evidenced clearly not only by stretch marks around her waist but also poke marks from the injections.

For the next twenty years, while our girls grew through their teenage years into adulthood, it was apparent to me that the bond between them and their mom was special. Over and above the obvious biological difference where only women can give birth and nurse their children, there is a degree of patience, gentleness and understanding mothers have for their children that is uniquely hers and not shared by fathers.

So, when Paul described his deep affection for his flock in Thessalonica, he used the metaphor of "a nursing mother taking care of her own children"! For the Apostle, his pastoral service to the church is likened to the gentleness, affection, and sacrifice of a mother (1 Thessalonians 2:7-8).

While Mother's Day calls for celebrations, it can also be a harrowing time for some. I'm referring to those who may have broken relationships with their mothers or those who have never known their biological mothers. To them, Mother's Day may be a reminder of the hurts and pains of an unpleasant childhood. To them, I hope they will be comforted by the words in 2 Corinthians 1:4, which reminds us that we worship "the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God."

Then there are those who are enduring the distress of dealing with infertility or a miscarriage. These experiences are all too familiar to us personally as we waited 10 years before Cynthia first conceived and subsequently suffered a miscarriage. For a woman living in a traditional Chinese society where barrenness is an affliction and losing an unborn is a curse, it was hard to live with the stigma of being childless. But our God is all sufficient and gracious. Just as He intervened in the lives of Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel, Hannah and Elizabeth who were without child, our God blessed us by granting us twins. And even if it is by His sovereign will that some may remain childless, we can rest assured that God has a different and higher purpose.

Mother's Day is a time to affirm the importance of motherhood, appreciate the unique role mothers have in the family, and thank the mothers who have devoted their lives to their children. It's only appropriate we conclude with a prayer:

Our Heavenly Father, it is with deep gratitude that we thank You for our mothers who have sacrificially loved and cared for us. For those who are mothers, we pray that You would grant them strength and wisdom to carry out their duties as You have purposed, and to raise their children to walk in Your ways. For those who find Mother's Day to bring sadness and regret, we pray that You would bring healing to their hearts, as well as joy and peace that surpasses all understanding. In Jesus' name, Amen!

When we realized that virtual FBC worship was here to stay, we decided to come together on Zoom to attend worship service together. We even "stay back" after the service for a time of fellowship. It is truly a great and meaningful experience.

What is Gamma 9 looking forward to this year?

We appreciate the love and comfort that comes from belonging to an LG, especially in times of sickness and grief. Recently, when we were informed of the needs of a community from Myanmar, all the LG members were quick to donate and aid was delivered to 100 families this Chinese New Year 2021. We look forward to God opening doors for us as a group to help the poor and share the testimony of
