devious weapon-temptation. Temptation makes mankind weak and succumb to self-destruction.

Jesus said in John 10:10a that "the thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy." He was of course referring to the devil. Jesus knew him well for the devil had tried his tricks on Jesus before, but to no avail. This was after Jesus fasted for 40 days in the wilderness.

There is a story on the internet that tells of how temptation leads to disaster:

A donkey was tied to a tree. The devil came and untied it. The donkey ran into the fields and began destroying the crops.

When the farmer's wife saw this, she shot the donkey. The donkey's owner got so upset that he shot the farmer's wife.

When the farmer saw his wife dead, he went and shot the donkey's owner. The wife of the owner of the donkey then told her son to avenge the death of his father and burn down the house of the farmer.

The boy went and carried out his mother's bidding, assuming that the farmer too would have been burnt alive, along with the house. Sadly for the boy, that wasn't the case. When the farmer came back to see the charred remains of his house, he promptly went and shot the wife and the son of the donkey's owner.

Struck by remorse, the farmer asked the devil why all those terrible things had to happen. The devil replied, "Why, I did nothing at all! Oh, except release the donkey. It was all of you who reacted, overacted and released the inner devil."

The devil doesn't do anything but wake us up by triggering the ego in us that turns into evil intent and goes about harming others, and ourselves!

The only thing the devil needs to do is simply release the donkey within us. That donkey is temptation.

Temptation comes in many forms. Common ones are lust, career, promotion, property, material things, fame, old flames, etc. This leads to sin, like pride, corruption, stealing and piracy.

The Bible has this instruction to beat back temptation in James 4:7: "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you." Of course, it's easier said than done, and for that reason, we need the wisdom and willpower of the Holy Spirit.

There is however one temptation for which the only escape is to flee: youthful passions. 2 Timothy 2:22 says, "So flee youthful passions and pursue righteousness, faith, love, and peace, along with those who call on the Lord from a pure heart." 'Youthful passions' are not confined to erotic pleasures; it includes the things of this world, like wealth, career, possessions, fame and recognition. Nevertheless, lust is high on the list.





Temptations have a way of sneaking up on us. A person does not become a drug, alcohol or sex addict deliberately. No one becomes an addict by simply wanting to become one. It is through engaging in drugs, alcohol or sex frivolously and, before you know it, those involved fall hook, line and sinker. You've become an addict.

Temptation also comes upon a person by challenging their ego and bravado. It overwhelms a person's reasoning and common sense, making them lose sight of what's good and decent.

In accident investigations, especially in aircraft accidents, investigators work backwards from the point of accident to when things began to unravel. This beginning is known as point zero. This point can be difficult to determine because it is often an innocent move.

Temptations are the point zeroes in broken lives. Temptation on its own is not a sin; it becomes a sin only when one yields to it. Every time we overcome temptation, a better person emerges, much like a phoenix rising from its own ashes.

The key to not getting into trouble is to not get tempted. However, this is easier said than done because more often than not, it's temptation that comes looking for you. You can flee from temptation, and that works sometimes, but not always.

Two things work against you. The first is that temptations are fast runners, and they may soon overtake your flight. The second is that temptations have endurance, and they may overtake you after you get tired of running away. This is especially true for temptations that create curiosity and doubt, just like when the serpent tempted Eve.

So, what are we to do? Hymn composer Horatio Richmond Palmer wrote:

Yield not to temptation, for yielding is sin Each victory will help you, some others to win Fight manfully onward, dark passions subdue Look ever to Jesus and he'll carry you through

Shun evil companions, bad language disdain God's name hold in reverence, don't take it in vain Be thoughtful and honest, kindhearted and true Look ever to Jesus, he'll carry you through

Ask the Saviour to help you Comfort, strengthen and keep you He is willing to aid you Jesus will carry you through •
