THE GOSPEL

The very last words of Jesus recorded before his ascension was a command given along with full authority and a promise that God would go with his disciples (Matthew 28:18-20). Almost as soon as he appears to the disciples upon his resurrection, Jesus also gave this command: "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation." (Mark 16:15). Later, in another conversation, he again reminds them of the command: "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the

earth." (Acts 1:8). In Jesus' death and resurrection, God had unleashed His gospel. And in Jesus' last moments on earth, contained in his last words, he extended an invitation to his people to take their place in the ongoing narrative of the gospel.

The book of Acts is a beautiful picture of the entire church taking hold of this command and invitation, resulting in the gospel being unleashed in the places the disciples lived in and travelled to. It was a gospel community praying, teaching, giving of their

resources, supporting, and sending their best to places yet to hear the gospel. For how can the unreached call on the One they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the One of whom someone preaching to them? And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? (Romans 10:14-15).

Today, more than 2000 years later, the command and invitation is still resounding through the church across the globe as more than 3 billion people have yet to hear the gospel. While many among us at FBC are not sent by God to the far-flung places on earth, we are still called to step into that invitation and be a part of the ongoing narrative of the gospel. There are many things we are doing and can do locally but, at the same time, we need to play an active role in sending and supporting those called by God into full-time missions to go to the ends of the earth, to gospel.

Here are 5 simple ways to consider as your response to Jesus' invitation:

Pray Faithfully

- Pray and ask the Lord to raise up missionaries from among us- even our children.
- Keep missionaries in your prayer list and pray specifically. (Being on their mailing list will provide specific prayer requests.)
- Pray for the nations. There are many resources, like **Operation World**.

Give Financially

- Your faithful giving to the FBC Missions Fund enables the church to support missionaries, full-time workers, and ministries like the discipleship efforts in Sabah.
- In the coming year FBC hopes to support even more missionaries, especially the younger generation and those from less affluent churches, who are often impeded by lack of funding.
- Every year, prayerfully ask God how much to set aside for your missions giving. Then, trust and obey.

Share the Gospel

- Be equipped to share the gospel.
- Pray and ask God for opportunities for gospel conversations with those around you.
- Make your home and Life Group a place of hospitality to the unchurched.

Read, Listen, and Tell

Include books on missions and about missionaries in your reading list. For example, <u>Latte to Lathi</u> by Jea Ng and <u>Pseudo Discipleship</u> by George Verwer.

- Sign up to receive newsletters from missionaries and various mission organisations to keep abreast with what God is doing in the world.
- Re-tell stories from missionaries to your children, Life Group, and friends as it's a great way to inspire and nurture a missional heart.

Advocate

- Learn about issues that plague our society such as human trafficking, the persecuted church, the plight of refugees, and equal access to education.
- Seek ways to bring kingdom light through the gospel, and advocate for change.

We, as a church, have been faithfully supporting the ministries of our brothers and sisters in Malaysia and around the world. As much as we miss hearing from them when we gather on Sundays, we know that this pandemic is also hitting them just as hard, if not remember them in our prayer, and to pray and respond to God's mission for ourselves - knowing that He has placed us in our specific context for a reason. We echo Paul's prayer in Ephesians 3:14-21 for our ministry partners and for FBC as we heed the call to unleash the gospel: "For this reason [we] kneel before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. [We] pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen [us] with Christ may dwell in [our] hearts through faith. And [we] pray that [we], being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge-that [we] may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! 

Benny Bobson bin Gubil: I believe nothing can stop the gospel from being shared. But the pandemic has made us the change the methods-like using the internet, and even using walkie-talkies and karaoke sound systems for areas without internet. Praise God that, by His grace and provision, I can face each day of seminary as I prepare to be a pastor and serve the local church.

Jason Kelly: The pandemic has changed our view of church life. Almost all churches have closed their physical doors to combat the spread of the coronavirus. Covid-19 hit us very hard but the changes are not all negative. Many pastors have intensified efforts to stay in touch with the members of their congregations and maintain their church communities. Now, we mostly communicate via text, Zoom, and WhatsApp, and most worship services are entirely online. Many have also shared that because of the pandemic, they are now back home in their villages and have been able to spend more time worshiping and praying together with their families. I believe in Philippians 4:13, which says: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." Part of being a Christian is sharing God's love with others. If you have known God's love and guidance through your life, you need to share that with others.

With or without Covid, most of my work is now online, coaching leaders via video calls. I have three roles in <u>OM</u>, and one of it is being the Regional Director for <u>TeenStreet Asia</u>, a youth discipleship movement. There are several countries wanting to develop TeenStreet, and the pandemic has propelled us to launch an online TeenStreet for all of Asia. It has been fun creating a conference that reflects the diversity of Asia.

The past year has been a year of transition in my roles at OM, and also moving homes. In addition to that, I haven't seen my sisters in almost two years. Yet, in all the ups and downs, God has been a constant, comforting presence. Experiencing transition in the midst of the lockdowns has been a time for me to create new rhythms for life and ministry. And I discovered gardening as a way to slow down and connect with God.

The recent pandemic opened up new ministry opportunities which otherwise would not be possible. For example, the plea for help by unseen, marginalized communities surfaced, which has allowed us to know where they are located. Most humanitarian NGOs by-pass these groups deemed "illegal" in the eyes of the authorities. But it is humanitarian aid that gains the people's trust, and this has opened doors for further missional engagement.

The unseen enemy (the Covid-19 pandemic) has brought the whole world to its knees. It reminds us of the vulnerability of mankind and is a timely reminder that we have no control over our lives. Our trust is only in the Lord, Who is unchanging and ever-loving in these uncertain times (Psalm 20:7).

The Covid-19 pandemic has brought great challenges for missionaries and missions work but <u>OMF</u> has faced other unique challenges before in its 126-year history. From the Boxer Uprising, to two World Wars, the Spanish flu, the Great Depression, and the Communist Revolution, missionaries had to adopt new and creative strategies to carry on the task of evangelizing people in East Asia and around the world every time. Field work and home-side work will merge in the years ahead and we hope that our experience as field workers will help us and others prepare for this.

We have continued to experience God's love and provision throughout the year in a very personal way. Our daughter was able to go back to India to finish her schooling despite the fearsome pandemic and was able to fly home safely. We also saw how God made it possible for some workers to carry on ministering in the field while doors opened to others to reach out and teach online. Attending courses with the Center of Expository Preaching brought a fresh delight to our reading of God's Word, and Zoom prayer sessions brought us together with a wider community of friends who love God.

ndergartens in Sa An Update from the Teachers



Making the best of pandemic uncertainties, the village kindergartens had to cope with different Standard Operating Procedures for teaching and learning, such as delivering teaching and learning from home, to customized on-site operations. We are thankful that most of the village kindergartens are pressing on with much wisdom and help from the Lord. It is heart-warming to witness the unity between parents and teachers. Besides cooperating with teachers in teaching and learning at home, parents have been helping to upkeep the kindergartens so that we can continue to provide early childhood education for their children.

Our fourth cohort of teachers taking the Diploma in Early Childhood Education Program (school holiday program mode) completed their 2 modules for Semester 5 in March, and we had to make adjustments to switch to online classes. Due to limited internet coverage in Sabah, some of the teachers had to gather in Pekan Ranau over a period of 2 weeks for their online classes and Semester 5 examination. Making the best of the situation, we also proceeded with our Online Teachers' Training for new teachers. Even though a couple of the teachers had to search for internet line on higher ground, we managed to cover 80% of the training. We thank God for all the trainers and especially teachers from the interior who made much effort to be online with the rest.
