British sprinter Derek Redmond had qualified for 400m semifinals with the fastest time in his heat. He was looking strong when he suddenly straightened up! His hamstring had torn. Instead of falling to the ground, Redmond continued to limp towards the finish line. Redmond was determined to finish the race despite the pain and tears, but his agony of pain held him back. Surprisingly, Redmond's father, Jim, ran to his son from the stands, waving off the security guards. With tears in both eyes, his dad sustained him and "the Redmonds" finished the race together. We may have heard of this heartwarming story which has since become a powerful



needed to be done. That's what grace does for us.

"When you run alone it's called Race but when God runs with you and in you, it's called Grace."

- Racheal Mensah

But the comparison is not exact. As Jim held his son, he exemplified grace, but it was Redmond's determination that got him to stand up and finish the race. This initial strength came from Redmond, not his father. Grace, on the other hand, is not like that. Everything in the Christian life is sustained by grace. It keeps the agony at bay. It provides upperbody strength. It strengthens his resolve. It eliminates other impediments. It is what keeps his heart beating. It keeps his gaze fixed on the finish line. Everything in the Christian life is sustained by grace.

As Paul said, "But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me was not without effect. No, I worked harder than all of them - yet not I, but the grace of God that was with me." (1 Cor.15:10, NIV). If you only read the words "I worked harder than all of them," you might think grace is like Jim supporting Redmond so he can show off his upper-body strength and finish the race. But that isn't going to work in this context due to the following two reasons:

- 1. Paul says, "But by the grace of God, I am what I am." In other words, Paul claims that all he has become and his extensive ministry are the result of God's grace. So, despite the fact that he is working hard to preach the gospel, his enablement is entirely a work of grace.
- 2. Paul added, "Yet not I, but the grace of God that was with me." Paul is pursuing holiness, righteousness, sharing the Gospel, and working with the gifts God has given him, but he is humble enough to recognize that even his hard labor is the result of God's grace in him.

credit and Paul taking some of the credit? Obviously not, as Paul cautions against this interpretation with the words, "Yet not I." Grace denotes the benevolent character quality that leads a benefactor, God, to bestow an unmerited favor on another. Grace has such an all-encompassing, all-influencing, all-sufficient, and all-necessary effect that when it has finished its work, you can say, "I worked, yet not I." It clearly implies that we do work, but that all of our work is the result of enabling grace. Paul elaborates by exhorting us to:

"...continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose." (Philippians 2:12b-13, NIV)

So, brothers and sisters in Christ, when we say here at the end of our spiritual journey that we are "sustained by all his grace," we do not mean that Jim sustains his son Redmond while we do our own independent work. We mean that everything on this spiritual journey is sustained by God's grace. As Paul said, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - not by works, so that no one can boast."(Ephesians 2:8-9, NIV)

Let him therefore that serveth do it by the power which God giveth (which is grace), that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ, to who be the glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.


